

## **Tips for Contacting Child Protective Services**

When you contact Child Protective Services, the intake worker will ask for information about the child and family including the information below. You <u>do not</u> need to know the answer to all of these questions; however it is helpful to write down the answers to as many of these questions as possible before calling Child Protective Services.

## The intake worker may request:

- The name, age, race, sex, and date of birth of child(ren)
- The address and phone number of child(ren) and parent(s)/caregiver(s)
- A description of family strengths
- The names of anyone who may be able to help support the family.
- The names of anyone else with knowledge of the family
- The description/nature of your concerns and any past observations of the family.
- Information about any known pets/weapons in home
- Information about any known history of substance abuse
- Information about any known history of domestic violence
